






Red Lake Rosie's Rescue is a 501 c 3 organization that is the first animal welfare program serving First Nation Reservation residents and their companion animals and is a model which is replicated in other areas.



The mission of RLRR is to end overpopulation of companion animals at Red Lake

- Since 2006 Red Lake Rosie's has spayed or neutered 7,813 companion animals living in Little Rock, Red Lake, Redby, and Ponemah communities preventing the birth of countless unwanted puppies and kittens.



BENEFITS OF REDUCING OVERPOPULATION OF DOGS AND CATS



- Increased lifespans for animals
- Better quality of life
- Less homeless animals
- Safer communities for people and animals
- Less disease in animals and people
- Renewed cultural connection to animoosh and gaziges

Help for the Homeless

- 992 dogs, cats, and wildlife have been rescued, sheltered and rehomed during the pandemic in 2020
- A shelter on the west boundary provides 22 kennels for dogs and cages for 20 cats.



Help for the Unwanted



- Over 11,000 homeless or unwanted companion animals have been rescued, sheltered and rehomed in the past 15 years .
- Many of these animals came in sick or injured and received treatment at the local veterinarian.

- Sadly in 2020 during the COVID-19 Pandemic our clinic warehouse was flooded with collapsed ceiling, discontinued water service and black mold infection. Our clinic found itself homeless. Only 159 animals were spayed or neutered that year compared to 452 in 2019. This represented a decrease of 65%.

Red Lake Animal Wellness Center Planning

- Red Lake Rosie's Rescue has been granted a Land Use Permit from the Red Lake Tribal Council on February 9, 2021. A floor plan is currently being developed for a new 72 x 30 foot building with a full basement. The facility will be centrally located in the village of Redby and be assessable to Red Lake residents and their companion animals.
- We seek the support of the Red Lake Tribal Council, community and other organizations and individuals outside our nation to help by donating to the Red Lake Animal Wellness Center Building Fund. Matches of \$156,000 have been provided by Joan Lawson and the Lawson Family Fund; Red Lake Tribal College and an Anonymous Donor.
